1. INTRODUCTION:-

Godda college was, with regular effort of freedom fighters and educationist, established on 15th August 1954. The name of the some of the founder member are- late Pd . Buddhinath Jha Kairav ,Jaykant Dubey, Shri Bhagwat Jha Azad, late Shri Sagar Mohan Pathak, Sri Prithavi Chandra Kisku, late Shri Chunka Hembrom, Shri Halder Sahay and Shri Jagdish Narayan Mandal . Before 1960 Godda college was functioning under Bihar University, After 1960 it came under Bhagalpur University. On 23 October 1959 old exiting Arts block building was inaugurated by late Shrimati Indira Gandhi. On 27 February 1976 this college was made constituent. In the year 1991 Sidhu Kanhu University was bifurcated from Bhagalpur University and now Godda college comes under Sidhu Kanhu Murmu University Dumka.

Through the distinctiveness as an academic institution over a long period of time, the authorities of the college believes in continuous improvement of this academic institution. Godda college for the first time was evaluated by NAAC in 2017 and it was awarded grade B score and has obtained a score of 2.16 CGPA on a scale of 4. Therefore the authorities in line with one of its mission to raise the realm of a good to great to greater through continuous quality assessment have voluntary started the academic audit since 2016 to look into its strength and weakness and identity the scope of further improvement.

2. THE AUDIT COMMITTEE :-

On sep 22,2021 Godda college Godda constituted a four member committee to conduct on academic and administrative audit of the college. The audit committee is comprised of the following persons.

The principal of the college Sri Satish Chandra Pathak at a preliminary meeting held on 23/09/2021 with the members, outline the objectives of the academic audit as an independent assessment of the college by the members comprising the above person. Accordingly, the audit team decided to into the prevailing situation at the college, along the aspect in course of the audit.

- Functioning of the laboratories and computer facilities
- Examination and evaluation system
- Activities of the internal quality assurance cell
- Library and research facility and sports office.

- Outreach programs conducted by the college including the NCC and NSS program.
- Aluminise and their contribution to the college.
- Opportunity and scope of improvements in the major functional areas.
- > The team is empowered and expected to express various views and give suggestion for improvement of the system being followed by the college .

5. Methodology:

At the meeting (held on 29/09/2021) with the principal, coordinator IQ AC, coordinator audit and other member of the audit committee a presentation was made by the coordinator of audit committee which give general and broad profile to the facilities and activities of the college. The new facility is added also found mention. The audit team visited the various department and facilities for brief interaction, the student of the department, strengths and support staff, visit to the computers specially the library and some of the other facilities of the college, arranged by the college to enable audit committee to acquire relevant first hand information.

Based on the information data gathered from the available documents and interaction accorded with the different component of the institution the audit committee has made a sincere endeavour to put formed certain views, observation and recommendation in the body of this report with expectation that this recommendation when implemented with best the interest of the college intended.

6. Brief profile of the college:

The college was founded on 15th August 1954 and was initially affiliated to Bihar University, Since its establishment the college has made remarkable improvement in the field of education in India over 65 years of its existence. Based on the commitment care and service preparing men and women for others division of Godda college is to promote a society based on love freedom liberty justice and equality. It is living up to its value statement of providing education with human face.

7. Awards and accolades:-

While reputation has grown over the years formal reorganization comes in 2017 from the national assessment accreditation council (NAAC) as a B grade college. The college has earned the following status over since its establishment.

- In the year 1976 the college was made constituent.
- In the year 1987 post graduation courses were introduced in all science subjects and in a few arts subject.
- > College has procured several award in inter College and inter University meet.
- In the year 2017 college was awarded B grade with a CGPA of 2.16 by NAAC.

8. Campus buildings and infrastructure :-

Godda college is situated in huge and massive campus of nearly 36 acres of land. It is situated near 3 km south of district headquarter but the boundary wall is provided to only eastern and front side of the college which have a iron gate . The old building for the arts block of the college was constructed in the year 1979 which accommodates the administrative block and all the arts department. The science block is relatively new and situated outside the arts block .Department of Education is also situated outside the old arts block which offered two years B.Ed course. A newly constructed library with all facilities to the staff and students is also situated outside the arts block.

Godda college all together have more than 30 rooms of different size and shape Out of these, 13 rooms are used for the examination purpose. Before the Pandemic the college have the capacity to accommodate more than 1300 examinees simultaneously for the examination but usually nearly 500 examiners are accommodated at the time for this purpose. All the rooms of the colleges are electrified and bulbs and fans have been provided to each and every room. Recently solar panels have been installed on the rooftop of the old arts block to provide solar power energy.

There are all together four hostels situated inside the college campus. One is exclusively for the scheduled tribe student one is for schedule caste students and one is for OBC students and a separate hostel is also provided to the students of minority community which is for some reason or other not being used. All these hostels can accommodate nearly 700 student and being run and maintained by the Welfare Department of Godda district

A Football cum Cricket ground is also there in college. The college auditorium is situated at one of the corner . Beside the other facilities include a basketball court ,a cycle and a motor cycle stand cum shed .A post office is also working in the old library building .

9. Admission process :-

Admission time usually starts in the mid of June and beginning of July .Any students can apply for admission in Godda college for intermediate, graduation and post graduation by opening chancellor portal. After that the University send the list of selected students to the college for admission. Seats for ST, SC, OBC applicants are reserved.

10. Courses offered :-

The courses offered by the college in three different stream Science, Arts and B.Ed are given in the following table. Some of subjects are having post graduate teaching facilities those may be included Hindi, Mathematics ,Persian,Philoshphy, Political Science , Zoology, Botany, Physics and Chemistry. Graduate courses offered in different subjects. But it is of three years duration while postgraduate courses are of 2 year duration. Choised Based Credit System CBCS semester system has been started by the university in the year 2012.

- In the meeting of development council, the members from University should come forward to attain it.
- For the purpose of saving college from in encroachment and stealing activities the boundary wall is a must for the college. For this the higher authorities situated at Ranchi have already written to Deputy Commissioner of Godda but no action has been taken yet.
- The present system of examination prevailing in the college and university is not bearing fruits.
- Promotion of teaching and non-teaching staff is a problem for college. Non teaching staffs are still getting their salary at 6th pay scale.

15. Main findings of the audit team.

Godda college has made tremendous progress and development since its inspection and establishment in 1954. This college was made constituted in the year 1976. In the year 1984 the team education department government of Bihar through its letter granted permission for teaching of Anthropology, Geography ,Biology, Psychology, Santali and also sanctioned two post each of teaching and non-teaching employees for all these subjects on the year 1987. Post graduate teaching where started in physics chemistry Biology ,Botany Mathematics ,Hindi ,Political Science optional and philosophy subject. Department of education for B.ed courses was started functioning in 2006

The college has nearly 2500 students enrolled to its registered in different stream and subject. The pass percentage of the college is more than 80%. Some of the students of this college used to secure position and rank in the University examination. Some students also quality for the merit list of different competitive examination. In the year 2017 this college was awarded B grade by the team of NAAC with a score of 2.16 CGPA on a total score of 4. Recently arrangements have been made for solar panel to supply solar power energy to the college. The college is also having Wi-Fi connectivity for uninterrupted internet facilities. Separate science block buildings and separate department of education for B.ed classes has already been constructed. A library building has been constructed which is also relatively new building.

- (11) Inadequate fan and lights are provided to the classroom.
- (12) No Vocational courses.
- (13) No placement cell no NCC in the college.
- (14) U.G.C arears or not getting cleared.
- (15) New teachers are not getting pension and PF facilities.
- (16) No HR department in college thereby immense work pressure.
- (17) Insufficient number of teaching staff as compared to student strength.
- (18) No arrangement for the medical emergency for staff and students on time.
- (19) No alumni association.

18. Suggestion and Recommendation for development & betterment of college.

- (1) Classes should be made tutorial based.
- (2) Gas plants should be made within college premises.
- (3) Canteen should be open for refreshment of student and staff.
- (4) More smart lecture theatre with gallery facilities should be provided to the college.
- (5) Restart the election of student union.
- (6) Boundary wall should be constructed through the 36 acre campus of the college.
- (7) National Cadet Corps NCC should restart functioning.
- (8) College campus should be made greenery oriented as plantation of trees and garden should be made.
- (9) Toilet should be cleaned on regular basis.
- (10) Drinking water availability should be provided throughout the college.
- (11) Job oriented like vocational courses should be included in the college curriculum.
- (12) Placement cell should be started with initiative to provide jobs to the graduate student.
- (13) More posts should be created for teaching and non teaching employees and vacant post should immediately be filled.
- (14) Teacher should impart quality education among the students. For this they should come full prepare in the class.

18. General conclusion

Godda college was initiated and established by the effort of freedom fighter in the year 1954. Arts building or the main building of the college was inaugurated by Indira Gandhi in the year 1959. This college was made constituent college in the year 1974. In the year 1987 for the first time post graduate teaching was started in 9 different arts and science subjects.

The college is situated nearly 3 km away from the district headquarter Godda. It is a be consisting of 36 acres of land, the college is co education institute and it has nearly 2,500 students enroll to its register. The pass percentage of the college is more than 80% this policy is a constituent college of Siddhu Kanhu Murmu University Dumka. Which is situated nearly 80 km from godda in the year 1970 for the first time this college was evaluated by the and ac team and awarded B grade with a score of 2.16 on a total score of in addition to that the following general conclusion may be ascertained:-

- Student discipline is good.
- Stand out as an institution of academic excellence.
